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What Do I Need?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paper or card for printing • Clean household sponges • Child appropriate paints of your choice • Plastic container lid
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How To?	<p>Use any clean household type sponges for this one. As an alternative, you can use the small sea sponges that you can purchase in beauty shops for a small cost.</p> <p>Arrange paint onto your lid. Use a variety of colours to create interest.</p> <p>Dip the sponge into the paint and start printing!</p> <p>Children enjoy seeing the differing patterns the sponges make. Encourage your child to use different parts of the sponge to create different effects. Using different colours is great for colour recognition and matching. Use the colour names as your child works.</p> <p>Good for making greeting cards and wrapping paper!</p>
