

<b>Theme</b>	<b>Red Party</b>
<b>Leading Up To</b>	Ensure that you send out invitations to your 'Red Party' with plenty of notice to ensure that everyone invited is able to come.
<b>What to Wear</b>	The children and adults are to wear anything Red today.
<b>Decorate</b>	Decorate the house or play areas with anything Red. Items could include balloons, streamers, crepe paper, cellophane, red chiffon, sheets, tablecloths, flowers, cushions, lamps, books, etc.
<b>Food</b>	<p>Serve Red food today!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Red Iced biscuits, red sprinkles, red jelly, red ice blocks, red apples, red pasta, noodles or rice (add a small amount of food colouring to the cooking water), strawberries, strawberry yoghurt, tomato sauce, cocktail frankfurts, tomato quiches, spaghetti bolognaise, cherry tomatoes, raspberries.</li> </ul>
<b>Games and Activities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Dramatic play – create your own red world. Add red material, red toys, red mats, red cushions, red dress-ups, or red pictures.</li> <li>▪ Art and Craft – make available red craft resources today such as paint, glue, play dough, pictures, pencils, red resource box items, or crayons.</li> <li>▪ Make your own red book</li> <li>▪ Make a red line using red electrical tape and have the children follow it to lunch, or walk along it balancing as a game.</li> <li>▪ Have red limbo – cover a broom handle with red crepe paper and the children can limbo underneath.</li> <li>▪ Group discussion – what is red at my house?</li> <li>▪ Matching Game – ask the children to locate red items from around the house to place in a basket. Discuss what they have found in a group session.</li> <li>▪ Remember to take photos of your Red Party.</li> </ul>
