

<b>Activity Name:</b>	<b>Let's Stomp in Puddles</b>	<b># 00119</b>
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<b>My Child Learns:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Gross motor coordination</b></li> <li>• <b>Mathematics – counting, volume, direction</b></li> </ul>
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<b>What Do I Need?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Gumboots or Wellingtons, rain coat &amp; hat</b></li> <li>• <b>A puddle outside</b></li> <li>• <b>Umbrella if desired or raining (for supervisor)</b></li> <li>• <b>Foil for a puddle (to make your own)</b></li> </ul>
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<b>How To?</b>	<p>On your next rainy day, pop on your gumboots, raincoat and hat and head outside. You might go to the park or just pop into your own back garden for some wet weather fun.</p> <p>Find some puddles to stomp in, jump in and splash through.</p> <p>Ideas on how to use your puddle:          Count how many times you can jump in and out of the puddle; watch the puddle volume change each time you jump; jump over, around and through your puddle; or hop on one leg, or balance on one foot standing in your puddle.</p> <p>If you don't wish to go outside in the wet, make your own indoor puddle (with all the trimmings!) from a large piece of tin foil. Repeat as above.</p>
