

<b>Activity Name:</b>	<b>Threading</b>	<b># 00135</b>
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<b>My Child Learns:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Increased fine motor control</li> </ul>
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<b>What Do I Need?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Buttons, Cotton Reels, macaroni or penne pasta, anything with a hole that can be used to thread.</li> <li>• String</li> </ul>
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<b>How To?</b>	<p><b>Cut your string into the desired length for threading.</b></p> <p><b>Thread your objects onto the string and secure the string with a knot at the end.</b></p> <p><b>You could turn your threading into a necklace as part of your Dress Up Box, or use it as a wind chime in your child's room. You might attach an interesting object to the end of the string and use your child's threading as a display piece, or use some sparkly objects to create a decoration for the Christmas Tree!</b></p> <p><b>For young children, use larger objects to make threading easier.</b></p>
