<b>What Do I Need?</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paddle Pop Sticks</li> <li>• Materials to use for eyes, a nose, mouth and hair, etc (you may chose to purchase these from your local craft shop, alternatively you can improvise using coloured paper, foil and other general household items).</li> <li>• A magnet base (available from craft shops)</li> <li>• Craft Glue or Hot Glue Gun</li> </ul>

<b>How To?</b>	<p>Using the paddle pop stick as your base, create a design for your magnet. You may choose to make a vehicle, a person, something from nature (like a tree), or an animal. Use your craft items and get creative!</p> <p>Once you have secured your pieces to your paddle pop stick using your glue gun or craft glue, allow it to dry.</p> <p>Again, using your glue gun or craft glue, secure your paddle pop stick to your magnet and allow it to dry. You now have your very own magnet for the fridge or office!</p>
