What Do I Need?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No additional Materials required

How To?	<p>Using your child’s favourite picture book or a magazine, talk about the colour ‘blue’. Point out things for your child that are blue and name them (for example: water, eyes, curtains, clothing, toys, etc). Ask your child to find you something that is blue.</p> <p>Spend time looking for things that are blue as you move through the day – you might find blue things at the park, at the shops, in the garden or on the television.</p> <p>To extend this activity, ask your child to record on a piece of paper how many blue things they were able to find along the way. They may wish to draw a picture of each one to remind them! Another great way to remind your child of the things you have found is to take photos of blue things as you go and at the end of the day, make a blue book!</p> <p>For young children, make sure that you use lots of repetition to help them remember.</p>
