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My Child Learns:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mathematics- numbers and counting
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What Do I Need?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No additional materials required • Paper and pencils (optional)
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How To?	<p>You can make this as simple or as complex as your child will allow. For young children, use up to the number 3. Older children can generally manage up to 10 or 20, depending on their prior knowledge of numbers.</p> <p>Count things in your environment, for example – there are five red cars on our street, I can see two taxis, I have four dogs at my house - almost anything can be counted.</p> <p>Count how many stairs there are in the house as walk up or down, count how many light bulbs in the front room, count how many photos there are on the wall, the sky is the limit.</p> <p>For older children, you can record on paper how many things you have been able to count. Have your child draw a picture of each item on the side of the page as a reference for them.</p>
